Student Council



Our aim at Playball is to introduce your child to sport in a positive, fun and non-intimidating way. The programme is progressive in nature and recognises the different stages of development in young children. This means that your child will be introduced to basic movement and ball skills in the initial stages of the programme and will progress to formalised and structured sports coaching in the latter stages of Playball. It is with great sadness that we have learned of the passing of two wonderful past colleagues of Nun's Cross National School in recent weeks.



Roland Evans was an exceptional teacher who taught in Nun's Cross school for many years. He had a great ability to inspire and feed the imagination of children. He was like a pied piper when children were around. Sadly, he had to retire early when he was diagnosed with Motor Neuron Disease. However, he had an indomitable spirit and made a number of return visits to see how the school was developing. Years after his retirement, parents of his pupils spoke of him with great affection. He was cared for by his loving wife, Annette, until she passed away following a long illness bravely borne. Mr Evans died suddenly on 11th September 2021. Our thoughts and prayers are with his son Peter, daughter Rebecca and his other family members at this sad time.



Stephanie McDonald who was a former

Principal of Nun's Cross NS for over 20 years, passed away peacefully in St Vincent's Private Hospital on 15th August. Her funeral service took place in Nun's Cross church and she was buried with her parents in Lorum churchyard, Co Carlow. The attendance at the funeral service was testament to her many interests, with people attending from diverse backgrounds. Mrs McDonald was also an active member of Killiskey parish and Secretary of the Select Vestry for six years. In addition, she was a member of the Unity Gospel Choir, she played table tennis, enjoyed foreign travel and table guizzes, was active in the ICA, walking groups and a photographic club. She kept up to date with technologies, of which her electric car was witness. She was a keen lover of animals, especially her cat "Mavros" who was a great comfort to her. Anything she turned her hand to she wanted to do well and yet she was unassuming. When Mrs McDonald became ill with cancer, she did not broadcast this fact widely but rather bore the pain with dignity. We console ourselves with the belief that she is at peace and pray that her

daughter Jennifer and Jennifer's father Brian, her brother Robert, other family members and her friends may be comforted as they remember her.

Mrs McDonald and Mr Evans will both be remembered with fond memories by all in the Nun's Cross community. May they Rest In Peace.
